For each of the paragraphs/#s below, provide the factual/constitutional/legal information that you gathered to help explain this point.

1. Multiple people said that it should be a woman's choice but others also talked about that God has chosen you to have a child therefore you shall give birth no matter what the circumstances. Others think it's wrong for you to kill the child if you made a mistake but if you were raped then they agreed that having an abortion is fine.
  - I asked this question because it was important to see what side everyone is on, because then I would get to see what their perspective of this issue is. Also, many people think abortion is wrong but think there are certain problems that occur like, if the women would get raped or if incest was the issue or even if the birth of the child would kill the mother. In 1973, the Roe v Wade case was crucial because a pregnant woman wanted to have an abortion meanwhile the other person didn't want that. The judge looked over the case and decided that every state with illegal abortions, was unconstitutional. The judge then changed the law of Texas and across the whole United States to make abortions legal.
